



MENANGLE DISTRICT PROBUS CLUB



DIDJANO D.P.R.B.

From last month, we finished with "Just where does that real and fair dinkum town water come from? Obviously from those big black and grey clouds that have hovered overhead for most of February and March.

Despite some thoughts that it may come from within the Warragamba catchment, our water comes from "down south" rather than "out west". We are fortunate to have, not all that far away from Menangle in geographic order from west to east: The Nepean; The Avon; The Cordeaux; and The Cataract Dams.



Downstream from the Avon Dam wall and the Cordeaux Dam wall the Avon and Cordeaux Rivers become one waterway. That waterway then joins the Nepean River, not far away in an easterly direction from Pheasants Nest Bridge, which is part of the main motorway between Sydney and Melbourne.

Lastly the Cataract River flows into the Nepean River downstream from Broughtons Pass closer to Douglas Park. Thereafter it is the Nepean River, before a name change at Yarramunda where it becomes the Hawkesbury River. It continues to flow as the Hawkesbury River, until at Brooklyn it flows with the big open and salty waters of Broken Bay.

The closest the Nepean gets to the Warragamba Dam wall is approximately 3.3 km. The Nepean has a somewhat humble origin. It rises not far from Robertson in the Eastern part of the Southern Highlands Region. There is a small bridge along the tourist road off the Illawarra Highway that crosses over the Nepean River, where at times it is just a gentle trickle. More about the dams and the upper canal next time.

The impact of flooding on these communities was significant, but these are resilient communities and we're sure that they will bounce back strongly over the coming months and years.

Volunteers from Menangle Rural Fire Brigade also assisted Police, SES and a number of other RFS brigades with a search and rescue operation near Wombeyan Caves in the Southern Highlands.
