#### **RAINBOW REFLECTIONS**

Greetings Dear Readers,

So much has happened in the three months since I wrote last November.

My beloved husband Brian was given a diagnosis of Motor Neuron Disease mid-November and died on the 6<sup>th</sup> of December. Our four children and I were sitting around his bed at Camden Hospital Palliative Care having shared a simple meal of toasted cafeteria sandwiches, when he breathed his last. We knew he was gone.

At the Menangle Carols on the 12<sup>th</sup> December (what a wonderful event!!!) God very kindly allowed me to see into heaven through Brian's eyes. He was, and is, worshipping God with all the Saints and Holy Angels in the Throne Room of Heaven! It is an enormous comfort to know where he is!

What we imagine on our best days pales into insignificance compared to the forever that is eternal life.

One of Brian's favourite scriptures was "It was good for me to be afflicted so that I may learn God's decrees". Psalm 119:17.

And learn them he did – during the 33 years that he lived with his disability Brian memorized whole chapters of the bible, finding strength and comfort in them. When he had trouble sleeping he would mentally recite them, and would soon doze off.

So it is quite a transition to go from a lifestyle that revolved around Brian, and catering for his disability, which in the last year included Support Workers constantly coming and going, to solitude! I'm loving it!!!!!

Mealtimes and evenings alone are a novelty for a while, but unbroken I can imagine loneliness would be an easy slide. My dear children are kindly allowing me sleepovers in their lovely, affectionate, crazy family homes to ensure that doesn't happen. This serves a double purpose as I also have a rest from the sorting and cleaning and organizing that I am undertaking to make "our home" into "my home". Not only have we never moved in the 45 years we have lived in Menangle, but we have lots of "just in case" items that are stashed and stored away. Our next Council cleanup will be very well supported.

In all of this – at every point, with every difficult decision, painful memory or deep emotion, I have learned a secret way to stay on an even keel – PRAISING GOD

I do not praise God for the difficulty, but I do

praise Him for His goodness is completely understanding it, and for already providing everything I need to find my way through it in peace and joy. God is faithful! Blessings and love, Sue

#### THE OLD AND REAL MENANGLE

Prior to the small estates contained within Riversford Close, St James Ave, Sulman Place, and Haines Place the Village was quitr small an contained.

Residentially it was basically just Menangle Road and Station Street.

Towards Campbelltown on the Western side of Menangle Road, the last cottage was what is now No. 90.

Along Station Street, the last house on the southern side was what is now No. 24, Coolibah Cottage.

Towards Douglas Park the last house on the eastern side of Menangle Road was what is now 135.

Lastly as you travelled towards Douglas Park the last cottage on the Western side of Menangle Road is what is now No 142. This cottage was part of No 3 Dairy which is now Mount Taurus. We must not forget the single cottage on the northern side of Station Street which adjoined the Rotolactor Paddock. The old metal shed next door was the Fire Station.

That was the Village of Menangle. Each of the Camden Park built – and Camden Park owned – cottages on the southern side of Station Street had a rear gate to allow access to the paddock between these properties and the Church on the hill.

It is believed that families who occupied these cottages wrer strongly encouraged by their employer to attend Sunday services. A single bell was tolled to announce when the church service was about to commence.

#### Check Your Hydrant

#### Do you know how many litres of water a Category 1 RFS Tanker holds?

Our Menangle RFS Category 1 Tanker holds 3,200 Litres of water. In a house fire or vehicle fire this could be exhausted quite quickly.

Having fast access to a hydrant can make a huge difference when fighting a house fire.

This month I would encourage everyone to look for the nearest fire hydrant to their home. Quite often these become overgrown with grass and can be difficult to locate or open.

<u>Please do not open the hydrant cover (hydrants have been known to house all sorts of eight legged and no</u> <u>legged creatures that we don't want you to encounter</u>). But clearing the grass around the hydrant and removing any debris that may be blocking access can greatly assist emergency services. You can even paint it 'Safety Yellow' to ensure that it is quickly visible.
