A BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVE

Spring is here! Such a beautiful time to enjoy our gardens.

The moon has been making the news in August with two supermoons (a full moon at the time it orbits closest to earth) - one of which was a blue moon (a second full moon in the same month!)



Quite spectacular!

The surface of the moon is highly reflective and is made visible by the sun's light rays.

Light is fascinating and is a frequently used metaphor in the bible. Light represents all that is good – e.g. "God is Light, and Him is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5). Jesus described Himself as the "Light of the World" (John 8:12). God sees all things and knows all things. The bible even goes so far as to say: "God upholds all things by His powerful word" (Heb1:3)

"The teaching of God's Word gives light, so even the simple can understand" (Psalm 119:130).

So, what difference does it make to see things with this light?

The biggest change for me has been the increase of peace of mind and heart. Since making a deliberate choice to trust that God is good, that He is in control, knows all things and is working out every single aspect of creation (including my life) for His purposes, I have so much more resilience.

When I hear disturbing news, or experience intensely difficult times, of course it impacts me, but it doesn't shake my foundations.

In the midst I can still thank God for His goodness, praise His greatness, and worship His holiness.

The absence of light leaves us ignorant and foolish. Sadly, we are all born lacking this light.

There is only one remedy, not a cheap or quick one. In fact, it is very costly. Just as God gave His son's life fully to redeem us from our ignorance, and offers us eternal life, so He requires us to give our lives fully to Him in return.

When we do, we are born again into the family of God. He is a good Father, just, fair, loving and kind.

He requires His children to be obedient and gives the gift of His own Spirit to live within and empower us to do so.

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade News September 2023 update



August has been a very busy month for Menangle Rural Fire Brigade. Most weekends this month the brigade has been assisting residents with pile burns on private property. This is fantastic as it demonstrates our residents are being proactive about reducing the fire risk on their property.

In addition to Hazard Reduction activities the brigade has also attended nine emergency call-outs to incidents including grass fires, vehicle fires, automated fire alarms and motor vehicle accidents.

Safe Pile Burning- Don't be a Fire Risk to Your Community

Since the start of August, there have been over 600 escaped burns across the state. We are urging landholders and property managers to exercise caution and follow the rules when conducting burns on your properties.

Although we are not officially in the Bushfire Danger Period you must still obtain a permit to burn from Wollondilly Shire Council.

If you intend to conduct a pile burn, it's important you check the weather before lighting up, inform your neighbours 24 hours in advance and notify the NSW RFS of your intention to burn.

If you need to conduct a pile burn on your property, but don't feel confident doing this on your own please contact Menangle Rural Fire Brigade and discuss the brigade assisting with the burn.
