Matt has worked tirelessly to make the Menangle School of Arts rebuild a reality, advising the Menangle Community Association through the very difficult process of Planning Approvals and Conditions of Consent. He continues to identify grant funding opportunities so we (the MCA) can see this project through to completion.

The Old Menangle School WSC project is progressing in a timely manner and will be another wonderful asset to the community of Menangle. Matt has been the driving force behind this. This development also includes the site for our Carols event (The Amphitheater) and the path to the top of Riversford Close.

Footpaths have been on the WSC agenda for many years (since St James Ave was built!) but funding has delayed the completion of these, over and over again. Some are Council funded, some Mirvac Developer funded.

Matt works hard to protect Menangle from rezoning and development that contradicts or diminishes the historical and agricultural significance of the area. With many other Councilors, Matt is currently pushing for a State Government buffer zone around EMAI as a protective measure both for EMAI and further housing development.

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade March 2024 Update

The February/ March period has been a busy period for Menangle Rural Fire Brigade. While we have not seen a large number of bush or grass fires this Summer the brigade has attended a large number of motor vehicle accidents. A reminder to all residents that our rural roads can be dangerous. Take care and drive to the conditions.

AFAC News has released the Bushfire Seasonal Outlook for Autumn. Due to recent rainfall and cooler, more moderate conditions expected over coming months, NSW is

predicted to see generally normal fire potential this season. During autumn, fire agencies and land managers will turn their attention towards conducting hazard reduction works, which includes planned burning across many areas of the state, where possible.

Helitank and Aerial Firefighting Familiarisation Exercise

This Summer Menangle Rural Fire Brigade along with Douglas Park Volunteer Rural Fire Brigade undertook a joint visit to Camden Airport to inspect two water bombing aircraft, FB249 and HT275, and be briefed on their operational abilities and also on safe working around firefighting aircraft.

This was an informative familiarisation exercise that gave members a great insight into aerial firefighting appliances and provided a refresher on how to work safely on the fireground when helitanks are operating. These are important skills for our members, as demonstrated recently when a number of helitanks were operating at the grass fire on Menangle Road in November, 2024.

Thank you to the RFS Crew at Camden airport for having us along.
