#### **EDITORIAL: The Big Picture!**

# MENANGLE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION INC. Update

The construction of the Menangle School of Arts Community Hall is progressing well. Thank you, Jim Nelson and your team! And the Old Menangle School Site is rapidly and beautifully being transformed!

The other item of great interest and generating much discussion at our last meeting was **connection of Menangle to the Sewer System.** 

At present Durham Green and the New Mirvac Estate Village have piped sewer collection and the effluent is trucked out for treatment either at West Camden or Glenfield Water Recycling Plants. The residents of the older parts of Menangle have been promised Sewage Collection by Sydney Water with each little housing development and then the promise has been broken.

The need for a Water Recycling Plant for the Wollondilly is extreme, and a high priority for us as a Community Association.

Our next MCA meeting is scheduled for May 23 at 7.00 pm at the Fire Shed.

We are setting up a Community Forum with SYDNEY WATER for 6.30pm for those interested in learning more.

#### **HAPPY MOTHERS' DAY!**

American activist Anna Jarvis created the holiday in honor of her own mother, who had organized women's groups to promote health and friendship in the West Virginia community in the USA.

Jarvis's mother had dreamed of a Memorial Day honoring all mothers' work. Jarvis promised to fulfill those wishes after her mother's death in 1905 to honor her memory.

On May 10, 1908, Jarvis held what is considered by many to be the first Mother's Day celebration.

In addition to conducting a memorial service in Philadelphia to honor all mothers, Jarvis sent 500 white carnations to her late mother's church in West Virginia, a flower that would come to be a symbol of the holiday.

The celebration rapidly caught on, and President Woodrow Wilson officially designated the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day on May 9, 1914.

The holiday's appeal to businesses played a significant role in its success, as florists, card companies, and other industries promoted the day. Jarvis saw this commercialization as a stark departure from her original intent for Mother's Day, and she spent the last years of her life attempting to abolish the holiday.

Today, Mother's Day is celebrated around the world, with billions of dollars spent yearly in the U.S. alone on cards, flowers, and gifts to celebrate mothers.

CHRYSANTHEMUMS & MOTHER'S DAY...

The tradition of giving chrysanthemums in Australia probably began as a marketing gimmick: "mums" for "Mums".

Mrs Janet Heyden, a resident of Sydney, began the tradition of annual gifts for mothers in 1924, during a visit to a patient at the Newington State Home for Women. She met many lonely and forgotten mothers there and to cheer them up, she rounded up support from local school children and businesses to donate and bring gifts to the women. Every year thereafter, Mrs Heyden raised increasing support for the project from local businesses and even the local Mayor. The day has since become commercialised.

### Menangle Rural Fire Brigade May 2024 Update



Menangle Fire Brigade has attended six call-outs this month to a range of emergencies including fires, Automated Fire Alarms and Motor Vehicle Accidents. A number of Hazard reduction burns planned for the month were postponed due to wet conditions and now been scheduled for the second half of May, 2024. Be sure to download Hazards Near Me so that you aware of planned Hazard Reduction activities and periods of poor air quality.

On Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2024 the Brigade's **Annual General Meeting** will take place. All community members are invited to attend the AGM. The meeting will

commence at 7pm at the Menangle Fire Station on Menangle Road, Menangle.

#### **Winter Fire Safety**

With Winter only a few weeks away it is a great time to take some proactive steps to reduce your risk of House Fire. Please read through the following Winter Fire Safety Tips from the NSW RFS and Fire and Rescue NSW:

#### **Fireplace and Chimneys:**

- Have your chimney serviced prior to using it by a qualified tradesperson.
- Purchase a fire screen if you do not own one. Fire screens should always be placed in front of fireplaces when in use.
- > Choose a safe place to store matches and lighters where children cannot reach and that is at least a metre away from the fireplace.

#### **Heaters:**

- Check your electric and gas heaters before you use them. If you suspect a fault have the item checked by a qualified repairer or replaced. Check all cords for fraying and damage. Plug heaters directly into wall sockets only.
- > Do not overload powerboards.
- Install any new heaters and use as per manufacturer's instructions.
- ➤ Check your portable outdoor heaters before use and have serviced or replaced if required. Ensure that the area where you plan to use them is level, well ventilated and away from awnings and other combustible materials.
- ➤ NEVER use any outdoor heating or cooking equipment inside your home including those that use 'heat beads' or LPG as a fuel source. This type of equipment is not suitable for indoor use and can lead to a build up of lethal gases which could be deadly. Check the manufacturer's recommendations before use.

#### **Electric Blankets:**

- ➤ Test your electric blanket before use by laying it on top of your bed, feeling the internal wires for any abnormalities and inspecting cords/controls for damage. Turn it on for 5 minutes and then feel for any uneven hot spots. If you notice any of the above the electric blanket should be replaced.
- ➤ Electric blankets are not designed to be used while sleeping. Consider adding additional bedding to keep warm if needed.

#### **Smoke Alarms:**

- ➤ Test that your smoke alarm/s are working. If not, change the batteries or replace the alarm.
- Check the smoke alarm is in date. Smoke alarms have a lifespan of ten years.
- Give the smoke alarm a vacuum, if you haven't done so in the last six months, to remove dust and any insects.
