EDITORIAL: The Big Picture!

Dear Reader.

War continues in the Middle East.

Since the unprovoked terrorist invasion and massacre of Israeli citizens on October 7th, ordinary everyday people like you and me have been suffering with an intensity never experienced in Australia. Can you imagine having someone in your family being held by terrorists as a hostage for over 9 months? The 120 hostages still being held are not all Jewish, the majority are, but there are nationals from other countries too. Compassion for innocent victims in this war is a given. Citizens who live under the rule of terrorists, such as Hamas in Gaza, are viewed by them as expendable, and used as human shields to protect the terrorists who rule over them. The only way to change this situation is to defeat their rule!

Since Israel became a nation in 1948 it has been subjected to many attacks from terrorist groups in neighbouring countries.

Terrorism can't be appeased. History shows us that. Nazism gained enormous conquests in Europe as the nations sought appeasement. Terrorism can only be opposed. Strongly. Militarily and in the Media.

Germany has learned a powerful lesson and now leads the way in opposing terrorism, even requiring its new citizens to pledge to oppose antisemitism.

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade July 2024 Update

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade has had a busy month, with ten call-outs in June 2024 including grass fires, automated fire alarms, animal rescues and multiple motor vehicle accidents.

The brigade's Community Engagement Officer Natalie attended the Australian Community Engagement and Fire Awareness Conference in Tamworth which was a great opportunity to share ideas and hear from a range of professionals from the Emergency Management sector across Australia and New Zealand.

Congratulations to brigade members Connor and Jarrod for completing their Village Firefighter qualification.

Community Building Partnership (CBP) Grant Program

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade was very excited to receive a \$72,272 grant as part of the NSW Government Community Building Partnership (CBP) Grant Program. The grant funding is for the purpose of shed amenities upgrade for training spaces for cadets/ juniors as well as increased storage and equipment upgrades for improved community support.



CBP Grants are available for projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes while promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion.

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade Junior Member Program

Children and young people play an important role within the NSW RFS and in local communities. Participation in NSW RFS activities can help children and young people connect with their community and develop a sense of social responsibility.

Menangle Brigade now offers junior membership for young people aged from 12 – 16 years.

Junior Members are not permitted to respond to emergencies however, they can participate in training and may assist with operational support activities like community engagement, catering and radio communications with the rest of the brigade. When they turn 16 Junior Members can apply to become operational members (with parental consent) and attend emergency incidents with other brigade members (once they have completed the required training).

MEMBERSHIP It is recommended that parents meet with brigade leaders before their child joins and regularly throughout their child's participation, to discuss the programs and arrangements that are in place locally to support young members.

To apply, a Membership Application Form must be completed by the child, authorised by his or her parents and endorsed by the brigade and District Office. As a Junior or Cadet member of the NSW RFS, a child:

- Is covered by insurance and workers' compensation provisions in the event of accident or injury;
- Can participate in authorised brigade activities which do not include operational response;
- Is entitled to wear NSW RFS uniform appropriate to their role; and
- Has access to MyRFS the website for NSW RFS members.

While Junior and Cadet Members cannot respond to emergency incidents such as bush fires, they can participate in supervised training which may include exposure to fire in a controlled environment.

All brigade members who are involved in the delivery of the Junior Member program have completed a criminal history check and First Aid training in accordance with the NSW RFS Code of Conduct and organisational standards of best practice.
