EDITORIAL: The Big Picture!

Dear Reader,

Welcome to the first of our Spring editions of the Menangle News. I love living in a place in which the second a change, the familiarity of



which the seasons change – the familiarity of the pattern of the seasons is comforting and encouraging, with each season having its challenges of course! And some unexpected weather as well. And of course we all agree that Menangle is the best place to live don't we! If I told you that I grew up in an orphanage, it would be partly true, but not completely true.

Neither of my parents knew God as their heavenly Father, so I was a **spiritual** orphan until the age of 25. My lifestyle was consistent with orphans living in an orphanage. I was fiercely competitive, argumentative and inwardly hated sharing anything. Mum taught us good manners, so I had a polite façade covering my otherwise self-centred life, and enjoyed talking to and laughing with people, so life wasn't all bad by any means. Mum was ahead of her time understanding nutrition, loving her vege garden, and we ate a lot of home-grown fresh produce, including copious amounts of eggs! Breakfast eggs scrambled, cakes and biscuits for afternoon tea and often dinner deserts like baked custard, rice pudding and queen of puddings were on the menu. In my later years I find that eggs trouble my digestive system so I tend to avoid them which could be psychological!

So back to the Orphanage lifestyle.

Sadly we are all born into it. The biblical narrative is that Adam and Eve "divorced" their heavenly Father and chose self-government instead. We know now that they were deceived out of their birthright, but they didn't know that then. The trouble with deception is you don't know that you are deceived.

Only God's Word is absolute truth! What a gift to be able to compare my thoughts, words and plans, with God's thoughts words and plans! And to have the privilege to be able to choose God's ways and be adopted into His family. I didn't understand this until I was 25 years old, when the Holy Spirit of God opened my mind to understand. 

OLD MENANGLE SCHOOL SITE Homeless Man.

From time to time a homeless man named Graham visits Menangle. He has been camping in the Old Menangle School Site. As far as I know, he is harmless. However, he does live in his own world of delusions, and almost certainly has mental health issues.

Wollondilly Council are not able to do anything and suggested the NSW Police Community non-emergency help line 131 444.

I phoned them yesterday on behalf of us as a community, and the safety of our children and elderly, but also for Graham to receive the help and accommodation he needs. The Narellan Police have picked him up and will arrange temporary housing.

OLD MENANGLE SCHOOL SITE Community Garden

The Old Menangle School project is a wonderful example of preserving history and creating a beautiful, functional community use space. Funding for the project has been provided by the NSW Govt. Public Space Legacy Program, Mirvac, Camden AGL Community Legacy Program and Council's Building Renewal Funds and Contributions.

Wollondilly Shire Council have been successful in receiving a grant for \$30,000 to work with a Menangle Community



Group to set up a Community Garden! The initial online Teams meeting which only I (Sue Peacock) attended with Council representatives from six different departments. A site visit was held by six members of Council six Menangle residents on 2 September.

Discussions were held about how we will operate: our design priorities; the Authority structure we will adopt; how we will recruit and induct volunteers; how produce will be distributed; and how we will future proof our Community Garden.

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade September 2024 Update

The end of Winter has been a busy time for Menangle Rural Fire Brigade with a number of call-outs to grass fires and out of control pile burns.

If you are undertaking a pile burn on your property, make sure you have checked the weather conditions, Fire Danger Rating and whether a Total Fire Ban is in place prior to lighting. Ensure you have the required permit and have the

necessary equipment on hand to safely undertake the burn. After undertaking a pile burn make sure that there is no smoke or hot and smouldering materials under the surface which could ignite vegetation around the burn. Don't be the fire risk to your community. If you do see smoke from old burns or an unattended pile burn, contact Triple Zero (000) immediately.

In August the brigade held a joint training session with Narellan Rural Fire Brigade to familiarise members with RFS Pumpers- trucks developed for the primary purpose of responding to village and structural incidents such as house fires and motor vehicle accidents.
