There are probably as many answers to that as there are people "Christ-Mass" is the Church's celebration of the birth of Jesus, singing beautiful carols, and remembering the gift God gave us. Jesus, who is wholly God came into the world, and became wholly human as well. An old, old story, but a good one! The birth of Jesus

transformed this world forever. Jesus who was without sin, took upon Himself the sin of the whole world, so that we, who are sinners could be transformed into Saints. A transformation that takes a lifetime.

The Hebrew word "Chanukah" means "dedication," and is thus named because it celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple in the second century BCE.

Israel was under the rule of Syrian Greeks who tried to impose Greek culture and beliefs on the Jewish people. A small band of faithful but poorly armed Jews, led by Judah the Maccabee, defeated one of the mightiest armies on earth, driving the Greeks from the land, and reclaiming the Holy Temple in Jerusalem.

Only a single day's worth of pure olive oil, could be found. They used it to light the Menorah. The light from that one single cruse miraculously continued to burn for eight days, by which time new pure oil could be prepared.

Chanukah 2024 begins at sunset on Christmas Day and ends at sunset on January 2nd.

Breathing Apparatus Operator Training

Menangle Rural Fire Brigade has recently begun the process of transitioning to a Village 2 Brigade. The change of classification reflects the significant growth in the population of Menangle and the expected changes to the type of call-outs the brigade will receive in the future. Part of this transition includes carrying Compressed Air Breathing Apparatus on our truck.

In anticipation of this change, October 2024 saw seven of our members successfully complete Breathing Apparatus Operator training. The course put our members to the test- learning how to quickly don and doff Compressed Air Breathing Apparatus, use the equipment safely, move through confined spaces wearing the equipment and practice car fire skills wearing BA.

This was a great course, all our members learned a lot and thoroughly enjoyed being put through some challenging practical activities. Congratulations to James McFarlane, Jim Nelson, Andrew Scott, Martin Scott, Natalie McMullen, James Doust and Connor Fownes on obtaining BAO certification.
