EDITORIAL - THE FAITH JOURNEY

Dear Reader,

Those of us who are in the second half of life have had ample opportunity to search for the meaning of life. I am reading a book by Richard Rohr "Falling Upward a spirituality for the two halves of life" and would love to share some of the insights he has included.

Our first half of life forms us into a "loyal soldier" similar to the "elder son" in Jesus' parable of the prodigal son. His very loyalty to strict meritocracy, to his own entitlement, to obedience and loyalty to his father, keeps him from the very "celebration" that same father has prepared, even though he begs the son to come to the feast" (Luke 18:9-14). The loyal soldier must be killed in order for us to hear and obey the deeper voice of God, It will sound an awful lot like the voices of risk, of trust, of surrender, of soul, of "common sense" of destiny, of love, of an intimate stranger, of your deepest self." (2)

- Instead of being ego-driven, you will begin to be soul-drawn. (3)
- Perfection is a mathematical or divine concept, goodness is a beautiful human concept that includes us all". (4)
- Every time God forgives us, God is saying that God's own rules do not matter as much as the relationship that God wants to create with us. (5)

All through the bible we see that God has been the very best of Fathers – He has set His moral standard by which every human being's behaviour will be measured. And alongside that, He has made various ways for those who admit their shortfall, to receive mercy and find grace.

Within one year of the beginning of Israel's history as a nation a system of sacrifices was set up that provided forgiveness and restored righteousness to them.

At the first coming of Jesus, these ongoing sacrifices were fulfilled by the once for all sacrifice of Jesus, the Son of Man, the Son of God. The Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in AD 70 which ended the System of Sacrifices.

Simply by believing, by faith and trust in Jesus we now have the way through which we find forgiveness and healing, and a restored relationship with the God and Father of us all.

Jesus is never upset at sinners (check it out!); he is only upset with people who do not think they are sinners! Jesus was fully at home with this tragic sense of life. He lived and rose inside it. I am now personally convinced that Jesus' ability to find higher order inside constant disorder is the very heart of His message – and why true gospel, as rare as it might be, still heals and renews all it touches. UPDATE ON THE WAR IN ISRAEL.

The first phase of the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas has ended. We still have approximately 24 hostages who may be alive in Gaza and 34 kidnapped or murdered dead bodies being held there.

It is not actually known how many of the hostages are still alive, although the statistics are becoming more clear with testimonies of recently released hostages. Many families have gone through this past year and a half in agony, not knowing if their loved ones are alive or dead.

It has become certain, however, that time is running out for those left behind, being deprived of food and basic hygiene, and of course medical care. Recently released hostage Eli Sharavi testified that he spent the entire last year in leg chains, deep under the ground, on a diet of less than 200 calories a day. It's astounding that he even survived.

This week the first phase of the ceasefire has ended. If talks cannot salvage the second stage, we will immediately return to active war and the fate of the remaining hostages will be in jeopardy. Israel is not willing to pull out of the Egyptian border of Gaza where arms are smuggled in or promise to end the war altogether.

Hamas, of course, is not willing to disarm and allow an outside coalition to govern Gaza.

There is great anger and division in Israel over these extremely complicated and emotionally charged issues.

Menangle RFS March 2025 Update

February was a relatively quiet month for Menangle Rural Fire Brigade with only four emergency call-outs. This included motor vehicles accidents, grass fires an oil spill and a bush fire.

A huge thank you to some fast-acting Menangle residents who spotted a grass fire that started in the rail corridor in February and very quickly called 000. This facilitated a very fast response from Menangle RFS and a number of other brigades who quickly extinguished the fire before it spread and before any

infrastructure was damaged.

Community Building Partnership Program

In 2024 it was announced that Menangle Rural Fire Brigade were successful in their application for a NSW Government Community Building Partnership Grant. The brigade was awarded \$72,272 to be used on brigade shed amenities including an upgrade of our training spaces for cadets/ juniors, increased storage and equipment upgrades for improved community support.

In return for grant funding the brigade's members have committed to contributing to a large number of volunteer hours to complete the renovations and upgrades. You will see several working bees taking place in coming months as the works are undertaken.

We are extremely grateful to be successful recipients of the Community Building Partnership team and look forward to the increased storage and functionality at the shed.
